

PHP before the Foundation: Structure

- History of over 25 years
- The PHP Project: Very informal structure based on traditions and merit
- "PHP Group"
 - A number of core contributors from the 90s and early 2000s but no formal influence on the PHP language.
- RFC process (introduced in 2011)
 - Who is allowed to vote?
 - Users that contributed code or documentation to PHP / extensions
 - Selected members of the community
- Commit access to php-src (core contributors) granted by merit








PHP before the Foundation: Companies

- Apple Market Cap \$2.76 trillion
- Facebook Market Cap \$629.5 billion
 - HHVM, failed to fund PHP
- Pfizer Market Cap \$207.58 billion
- Flipkart Valuation \$37.6 billion
- Slack Sold for \$27.7 billion
- Spotify Market Cap \$28.90 billion
- Etsy Market Cap \$10.99 billion
 - Still employ Rasmus Lerdorf
- etc.

 - Does it make sense to look for a replacement and pay for just one developer again?
- Instead: JetBrains reaches out to core devs and key companies in PHP to evaluate alternatives


"The primary task of the Foundation will be to fund developers to work on PHP."
